Immanuel worship services are on Plainview cable channel 20 (both HBC and Mid-Continent). HBC broadcast times are at 8:00 a.m. Sunday mornings and 6:00 p.m. Wednesday evenings. Mid-Co replays the service as volunteers and/or City Hall staff load a DVD recording. This can result in inconsistent playback which is beyond our control. Services are also online via YouTube.
