<u>Save the date!</u> On Tuesday, September 22 at 7:00 p.m. we will have a watch party in support of the Living Hope orphanage in Puebla, Mexico. This is the orphanage several of our youth traveled to in March 2019 and were very touched by the ministry they provided to the orphanage and staff. Another trip is being considered for March 2021!

<u>Release Time</u> is a Christian education ministry our area churches have supported for public school children in grades 1 - 6. Due to COVID19 conditions and precautions, Release Time will not be held this year. However, we have been promised by PEM administration that it will be returned next year if the pandemic has eased.

<u>COVID19 Service Plans</u> – the Board of Elders met and in cooperation with the Trustees have decided that our Sunday services will remain in the CLC until further notice. Ease of crowd flow and easier cleaning were the main drivers. Two services will continue to be provided at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. Pastor is working with Sunday School leaders on what we will be doing for that in

September.

<u>Mask Requirements</u> – Per Governor Walz' executive order #81, masks are now required as of July 25 for all indoor gatherings. The Elders request your cooperation with this effort to love our neighbors who may be vulnerable to COVID19.

<u>Home Communion Visits</u> – If you or a loved one are sheltering at home during the pandemic and desire Holy Communion, please know that Pastor is willing to set up a visit to bring you the body and blood of Jesus for your forgiveness and strength. <u>Fish Fry Fundraiser</u> - Over the past 10 years, Immanuel Lutheran School has had a fish fry & auction to raise funds for new technology at ILS. Since the Coronavirus has changed our lives over the past few months, Immanuel Lutheran School will not be having our regular fish fry & auction in 2020. SCRIP program update: The SCRIP program is being discontinued at Immanuel. For many years it has been run without a volunteer to lead the program and was not profitable for the amount of time the office staff put into it. The payback on many cards is down to 1-4 cents per dollar sold. Therefore, the Board of Ed has decided to end the program and focus on more profitable and sustainable fundraisers. On the resource table you will find the current inventory of SCRIP cards. We would like to sell as much as possible at face value before we are forced to sell them for a fraction of their worth. There is over \$5,500 of gift cards available that when sold goes immediately to the ILS general fund for school needs.
