Stewardship of Your Treasure Through Your Estate Plan

Did you know that Abraham Lincoln died without a Will? That's right, the 16th President of the United States and one of the most famous lawyers in history. If this could happen to honest Abe, how easy it would be for you and me to forget about planning our estate. Don't leave a lifetime of hard work and investments to chance. Here are 10 reasons why you need to have an estate plan:

Stewardship of Your Treasure Through Your IRA

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was enacted on March 27, 2020. One notable change arising from the CARES Act is the required minimum distribution (RMD) waiver for 2020. This provision will permit IRA and other qualified retirement plan owners to retain funds in their IRAs. Because the markets declined substantially after the current RMD was calculated based on the plan value on December 31, 2019, Congress determined that it was beneficial to waive the RMD for 2020.

You may be looking for a way to make a big difference to help further the work of Immanuel (or another charity of choice). If you are 70¹/₂ or older, you may also be interested in a way to lower the income and taxes from your IRA withdrawals. Benefits of an IRA charitable rollover include:

- Avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to the charity. •
- Make a gift that is not subject to the deduction limits on charitable gifts.

How an IRA charitable rollover gift works:

- 1. Contact your IRA plan administrator to make a gift from your IRA to Immanuel Lutheran Church.
- Your IRA funds will be directly transferred to Immanuel. 2.
- 3. Please note that IRA charitable rollover gifts do not qualify for a charitable deduction.
- 4. Contact the church office or Treasurer if you wish for your gift to be used for a specific purpose.
