**Financial Update:** As this crazy year comes to a close, the Board of Stewardship and Church Council are so very grateful to all our members who have contributed to the ministry of the Gospel at Immanuel. As of November 30, our expenses have exceeded our giving by **\$14,122.42**. A recent article (https://thefederalist.com/2020/12/10/new-mental-health-survey-shows-conservatives-were-right-church-is-essential/) noted the importance of faith: "According to the results of a new Gallup self-assessment survey, Americans' mental health is at its lowest point in two decades... except for devout religious people. Remarkably, faithful churchgoers were the only people who reported <u>improvements</u> in mental health since last year... While many people's suffering increased exponentially in 2020, economically, physically, and spiritually, they needed the hope that only the gospel can afford..." Church is essential because the Gospel is essential for peace in this world and joy for the world to come.
