<u>Sabbatical for Pastor Augustine</u> – Beginning this Tuesday, Pastor will be taking a special leave of absence call a sabbatical. This will be from Tuesday, July 11 to Monday, July 31. Please come and support the guest pastors who will serve in his absence. Read on for more information.

What is a sabbatical? You may have heard the term in connection with higher education when a professor would take some time away from teaching to do research or further academic study. When is comes to the Church and the pastoral ministry, a sabbatical is an intentional time away from the rigors of the ministry to recharge the batteries by doing other activities, traveling, attend retreats, etc. to allow his soul and body to be renewed for ministry. Pastoral health studies indicate that pastors and their congregations are well served when a pastor can take a three-week to three-month leave every seven years.

Why is Pastor taking a sabbatical? Doesn't he get vacation? Studies of why pastors leave the ministry show that the spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical demands of ministry can become overwhelming after a time. In one study, it reported the average time in ministry was seven years before burnout took too much of a toll that the pastor left the ministry. During COVID, the number of pastors that left the ministry increased, and many church bodies, including the LCMS, provided further resources to pastors and church workers to help diagnose burnout. Pastor Augustine has never had any extended time off in his 14 years of service to the Church. He has completed 8 years of that at Immanuel, a congregation of over 700 souls that probably should be served by two pastors with the amount of work to be done with that many members and the school. He has always used his vacation and is thankful for that time off. But the past few years have taken a greater toll on his well-being and signs of burnout were evident to him. Therefore, he requested the shortest recommended time of three weeks during July when ministry demands are lighter than the rest of the year.

What if something happens? Pastoral coverage is in place for Sunday services as well as dayto-day activity. Pastor John Fuchs will continue to do the regular monthly visitations. If you simply want a Communion visit, you can call him at home: 534-6565. For other urgent things like a hospital call, hospice care, or a funeral, Pastor Dale Kohrs can be called on his cellphone: (507) 525-3844. You can call an elder, too, and he will do what he can to take care of the situation.

Is there anything I can or should do? <u>Pray</u> for Pastor and Kim and the family. The wife and family also bear the burden when a pastor is struggling to get the work done. Pray for peace and rest. <u>Keep coming</u> to church. <u>Keep giving</u> your offerings. <u>Look at your own life</u> and how you might be more faithful with your time and talent to be a blessing and not a burden. <u>Respect</u> that he will not be checking emails or returning phone calls or texts to truly unplug from the 24/7 responsibilities to the flock. <u>Welcome</u> him back in August!
